Excerpt from the Thaw Catalog: The canoe is merely a folded piece of bark, without any technical detail. Decorated with arcadian scenery it has become a symbol, immediately understood by the Victorian tourist. Without hair embroidery on them, such simple canoe models are still being sold at many tourist outlets, attesting to their enduring symbolism.
